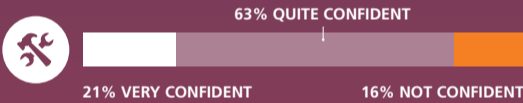

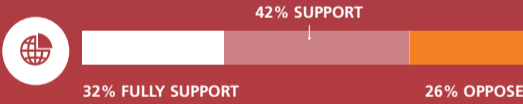

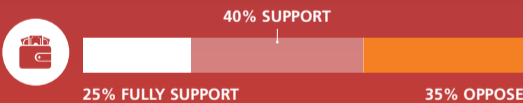

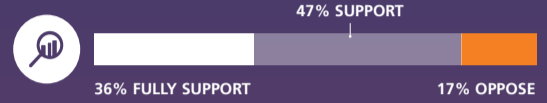

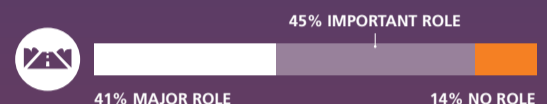
Local government should make better use of their current funding tools

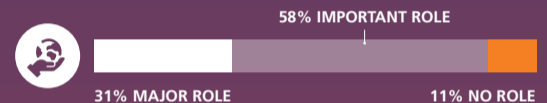
What role should the following funding mechanisms play in bolstering investment in rail in New Zealand?
